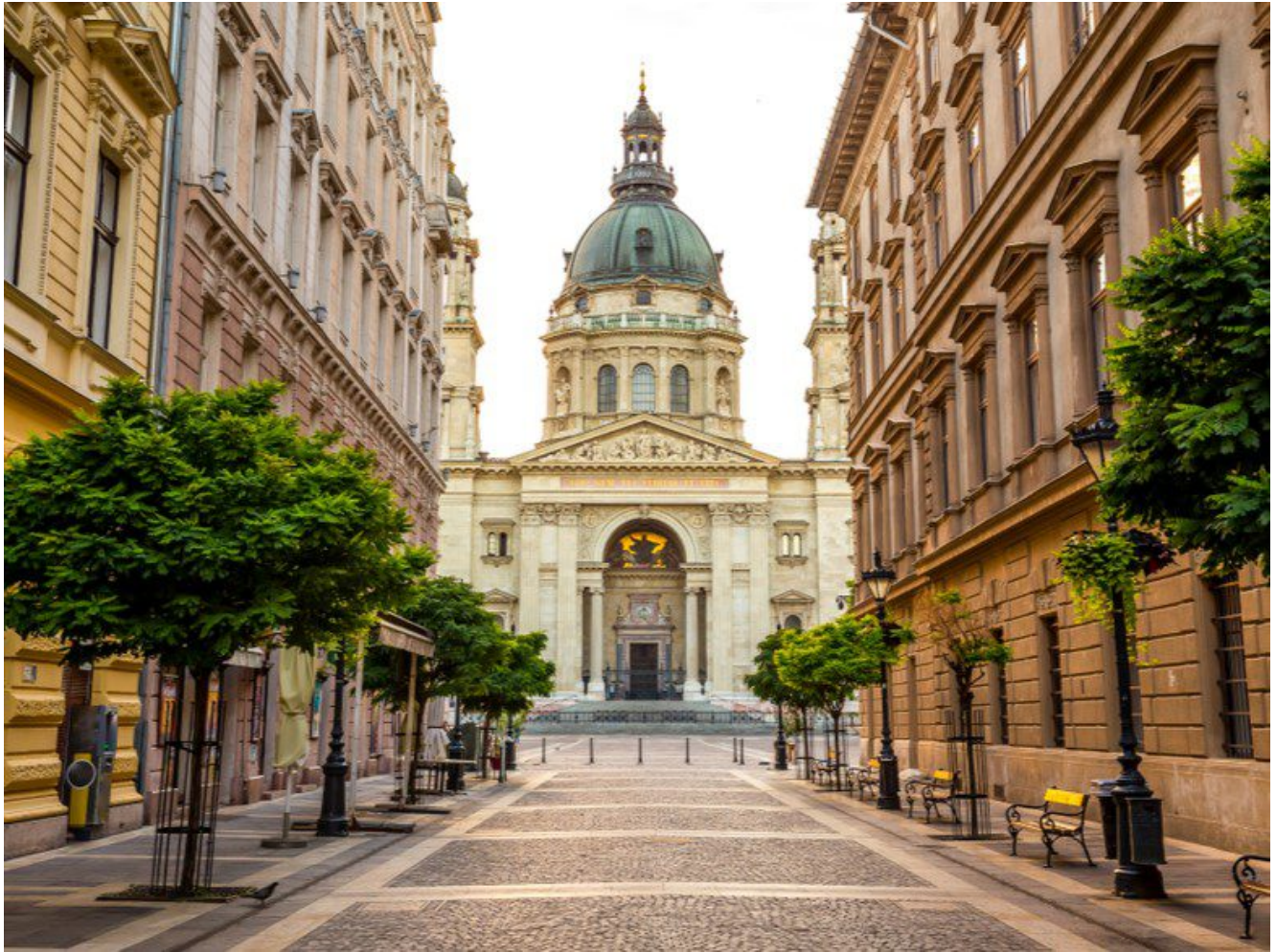

How to Move around Budapest

There are several options for purchasing tickets and passes for Budapest's public transportation system.

Single tickets are valid for one journey on any mode of transportation. Day passes offer unlimited travel for one day, while travelcards are available for multiple days or weeks.

The Budapest metro system consists of **four lines** (M1, M2, M3, and M4).

The M1 line is the oldest underground railway in continental Europe, dating back to 1896. The M2 line is the longest, connecting the western and eastern parts of the city. The M3 line runs north-south, and the M4 line is the newest, connecting the city center with the southern suburbs.

The metro trains are clean, modern, and run frequently, especially during peak hours. Trams have been a part of Budapest's transportation system since the late 19th century. **There are several tram lines that crisscross the city,** connecting popular tourist attractions and residential areas.
